Cannock Chase Council's Engineering and Services Officer had completed a site visit of the proposed location for the Bike Racks on the main car park in Heath Hayes and advised Property Services that they had no objection to the grant of a licence to the Parish Council for the bike racks subject to:

- Site visit to agree the position, type of rack and number of bays to be occupied (maximum of 2)
- A Licence being granted by CCDC to indemnify CCDC against any claims arising from the bike racks being positioned on the car park, any future maintenance to the racks and the subsequent removal of the racks if they prove not to be required in future or reach the end of their usable life.
- Each party agreeing to meet its own costs in the matter.

Council considered three options.

Resolved: To order one 6 space decorative modular bike rack from Barriers Direct, subject to receiving relevant licences from Cannock Chase Council.

09/21/94.0 Traffic Wardens

Cllr Thompson advised Council of the update received from Staffordshire County Council:

Following further checks with the Civil Enforcement team we confirm that the Parish Council had no legal power to issue Penalty Charge Notices on a public highway.

In terms of a partnership or financial contribution, we do not get into specific and dedicated arrangements with individual organisations, as we will continue to visit a location if contraventions continue, if we get into a financial contribution, we would be obliged to continue to visit a location perhaps when no issues are occurring.

Unfortunately, neither options are feasible in this case.

However, the Civil Enforcement Officers would continue with the mobile patrol that enforces around the local areas of Cannock. These are split up into the following areas: Hednesford & Heath Hayes/Wimblebury, Hednesford & Blackfords/Cannock, Hednesford & Norton Canes/Jerome, Hednesford & Rugeley, Hednesford & Bridgetown/Longford.

The team had agreed to add extra patrols concentrating on Heath Hayes / Wimblebury and Norton for the next few weeks.

The Clerk to write to the Staffordshire Commissioner for Police requesting that PCSO be given the authority to issue parking fines, Council felt this would be very beneficial. The Clerk would write to local School to ask their parents if they could be encouraged to walk to school.
