The Chairman thanked everybody for their assistance with the Remembrance Sunday service and thanked all Councillors that had assisted with the Christmas Trees and decorations in Heath Hayes and Wimblebury.

The Chairman had attended a small light switch on at Salisbury Drive and assisted Firework with an alternative venue for their Christmas Event and helped out with refreshments during the evening. The Chairman requested a letter of thanks be sent to St John's Church.

12/21/147.0 Western Power

Western Power updated Council on work within the area. One million pounds would be spent in Heath Hayes over the next few years replacing the contact cables underground, this would improve the network to allow for extra power if required. Western Power had good communications with residents.

12/21/148.0 Cannock Chase Can

Cannock Chase Can presented their new project to Council. The app was to improve and encourage a better lifestyle, healthier mind and body. Cannel Mount would be incorporated into the app using a QR code trail. Five Ways Primary, Gorsemoor Primary, Heath Hayes Academy, Kingsmead and Little Chimps nursery would be involved. The app would be released in January on apple and android. A 5-year programme is in place with a total budget cost of £2,650. Parish support requested £800.

Resolved: Council agreed to support the project, £800 would be taken from Cannel Mount budget.

12/21/149.0 Clerks Report

• The Clerk attended a Town/Parish Meeting re the Commonwealth Games
The Games would run from the 27/07/22 to 08/08/22 with Forestry England hosting the mountain
biking event on the 03/8/22 the men's event was planned during the morning and the ladies' event
during the afternoon. It was expected that 10,000 to 12,000 spectators would attend, only 3,000
seated tickets would be available.

The Council was still awaiting confirmation of the Queens Baton Relay to be finalized. Schools and Colleges engagement was taking place making them aware of the Commonwealth Games and the importance of being active.

Lots of roadshows would be set up within the district and short events that the commonwealth games would host, but they would also like the Parish and Towns to get involved in live broadcasting events. There were various packages available varying from £4k to £6K. £4k budget would hire you a large digital screen, deckchairs and license for the day to broadcast anything you would like, the £6k budget would include street dressing.

• In the summer the Council agreed that they would like to be involved in a campaign to tackle loneliness in the Parish. The Clerk had a meeting with Vicky Rowley re loneliness to explore what the Parish Council could do.

The Parish had been identified as a high-risk area, calculated on age, health, lone living. Loneliness can hit the old and vulnerable but working and single moms were also identified. It's not just about offering café, knitting clubs etc. other ideas were a chatty bench in the village, walking groups for all ages. Age UK Loneliness heat map <u>Cannock Chase Local Authority (ageuk.org.uk)</u>. Fuel poverty was a specific issue in Heath Hayes & Wimblebury.
